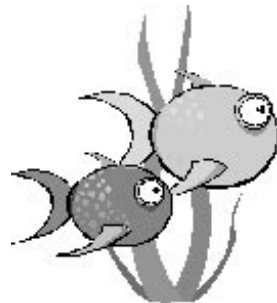
DINNER RAFFLE

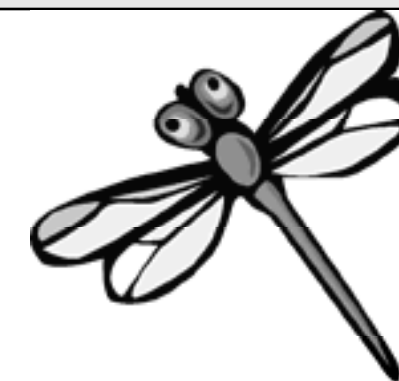
Deal or No Deal?
