

## From the Director's Desk

### New Catalogue and Circulation System

CLAN (Cooperating Libraries Automated Network), of which we are a member, is changing to a new operating system. Our continued growth necessitates a system with more capacity. You will notice the change around March 25. During the switch from Horizon to Millennium you may not be able to access the on-line catalogue, place reserves, or access your patron record. The transition period will take about three days, after which you will see a new catalogue. The library staff will be happy to answer your questions and to help you with any problems you may encounter.

The new system will require the use of your library card for borrowing materials. **YOU WILL BE REQUIRED TO SHOW YOUR LIBRARY CARD FOR ALL CHECKOUTS on and after MARCH 25.** To make your life easier we are going to offer you a choice of a traditional credit card sized library card and a key ring fob card. There will be no charge to obtain the key ring fob card.

We want this transition to be as transparent for you as possible. I hope you will take advantage of the key ring fob cards and utilize the staff for assistance as needed.
