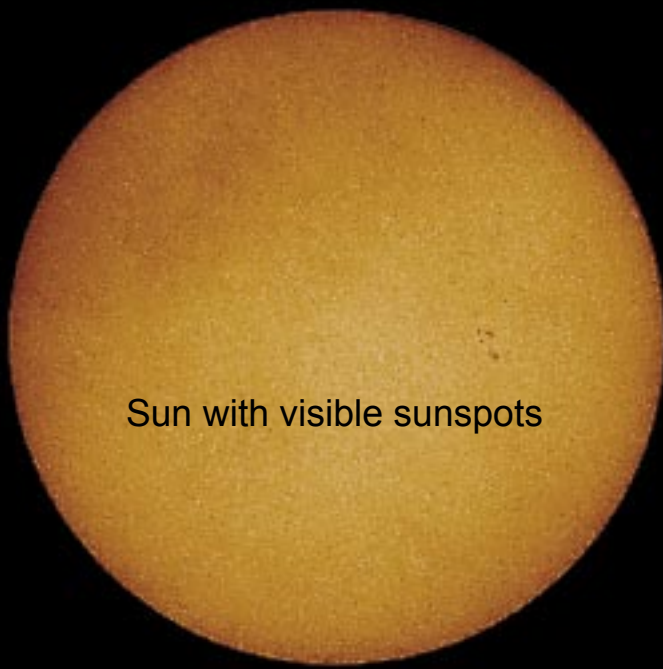

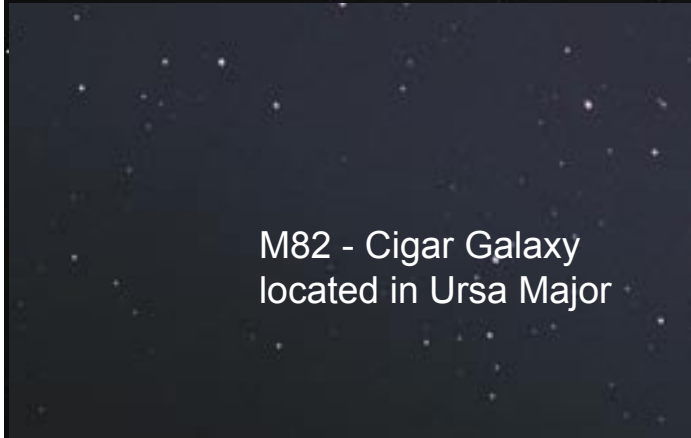

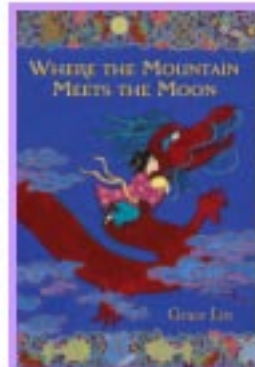
Children's Bubble Display

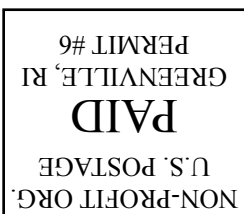
