#### NEEDLES AND THREAD: ADULT BEGINNER SEWING CLASS

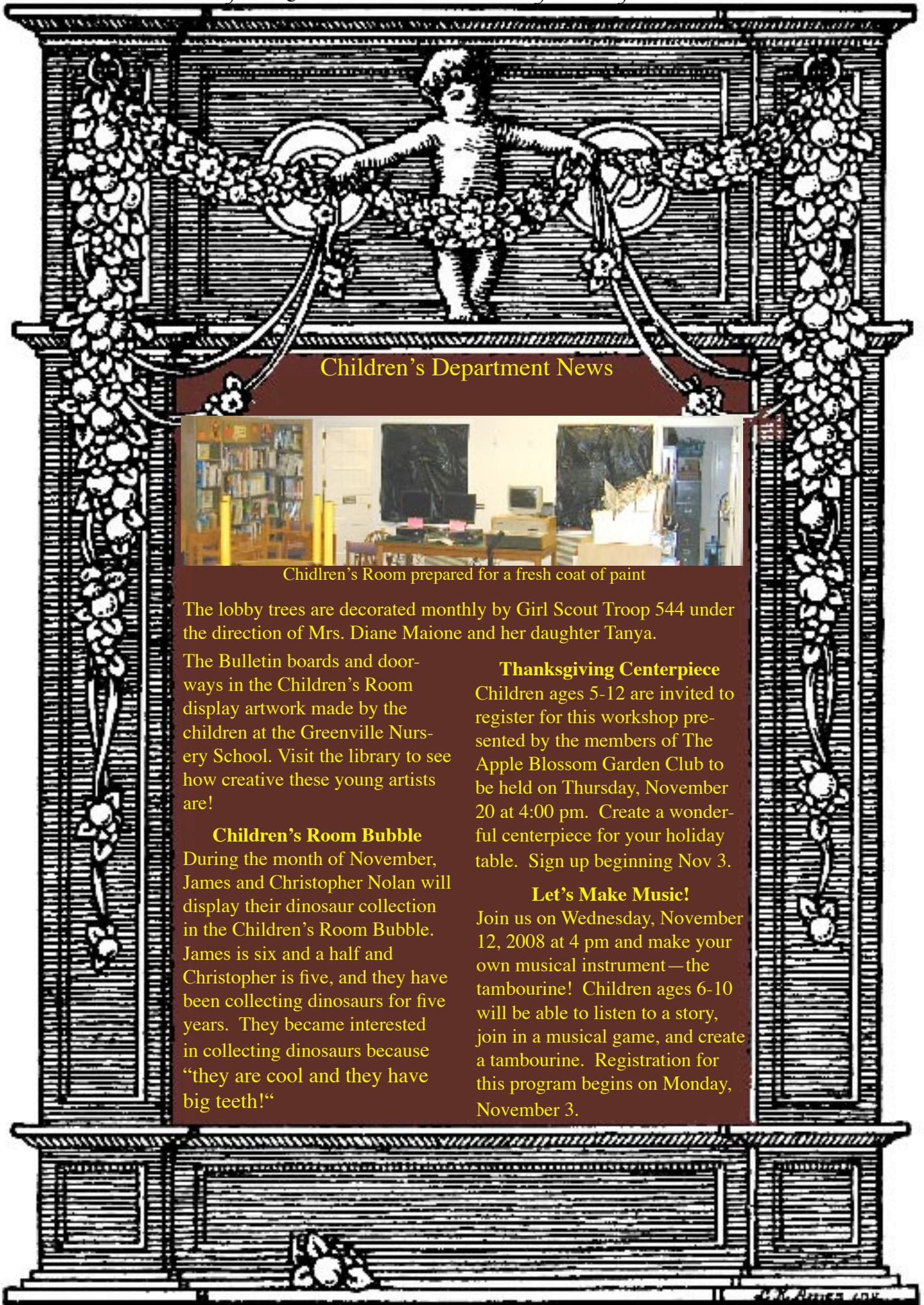

### Children's Room Bubble

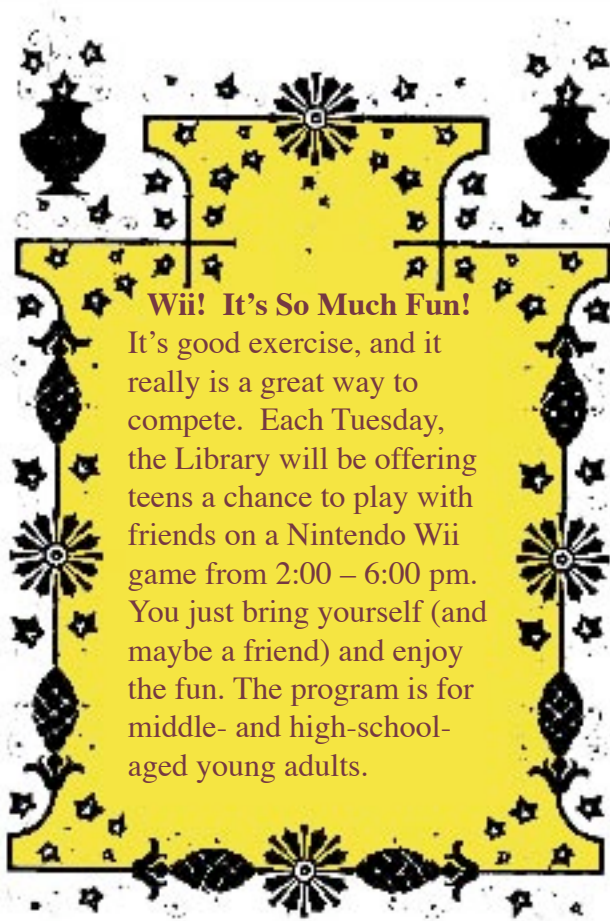

### Let's Make Music!

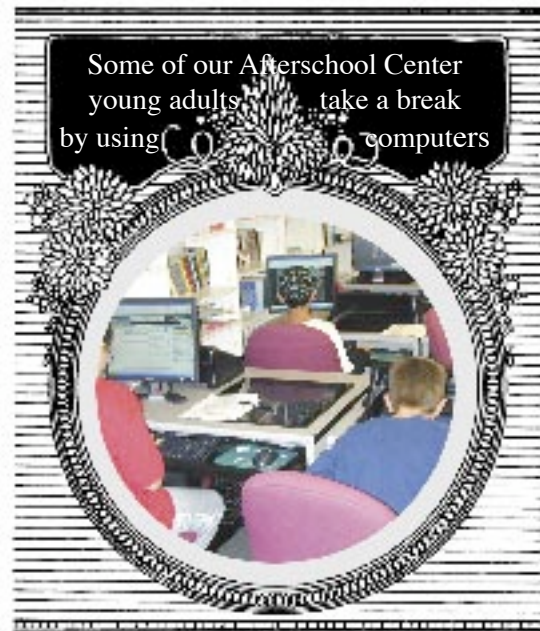

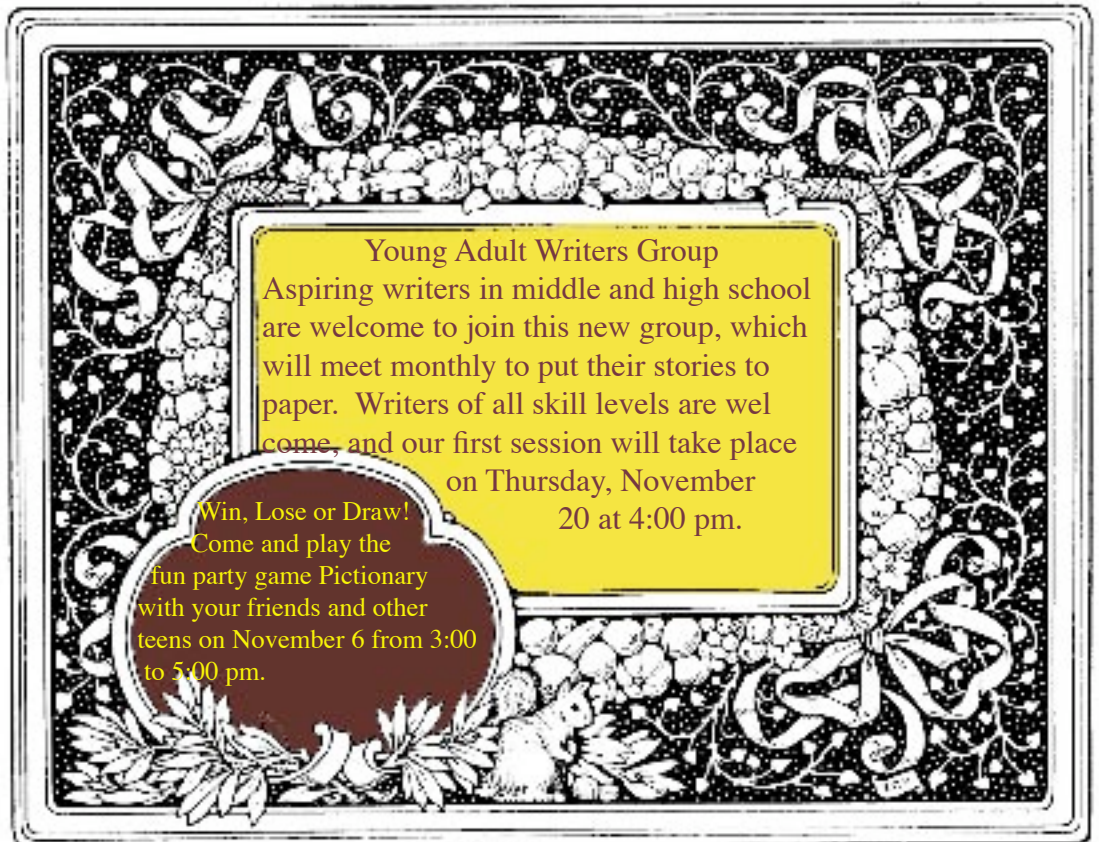

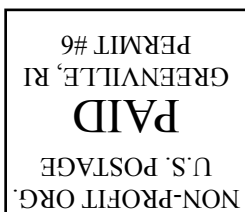
