Feb 15, 1933 At the meeting of Board, same time and place - The Treasurer, Mr. Mowry was authorized to confer with Mr. McLaughly of Town Budget committee requesting the town to continue appropriation of \$200.00 for the use of the Library. The President Rev. S. A. Burgess was authorized to bring the matter before the Financial Town Meeting in April, if this should prove to be necessary. Miss Burlingame, Librarian was authorized to purchase new leaves for two record books. - Adjourned - M. W. Secretary

May 20 - 1933 The Annual Meeting of the Keswille Library Association was held in the Library Building, President S. A. Burgess presiding. The reports of officers were received and approved. The Secretary gave reports of Feb. quarterly meeting. The Treasurer's report was ordered placed on file. He reported a balance of \$159.93. The savings account \$1273.65.

The Librarian reported 7770 volumes for circulation, with books of reference bringing total to 8342 " " . Total circulation 5584 volumes. No of patrons 318. Of this number 66 new, and 42 children.

Book committee reported \$190.89 received from State fund. 36 vol. fiction purchased \$63.63; 67 vol. general literature \$127.26. This is in accordance with State ruling. Of Town money \$8.65 was spent for books.
