May 19, 1934 - The Annual Meeting was held with good attendance. The Secretary's report was read and approved. The Secretary reported that the Biennial Report was filed with the Secretary of State and tax of \$2.00 paid, according to law.

The Treasurer's Report, audited by Mr. S. Clemens was accepted.

The Treasurer reported \$100 received from the Town of Smithfield for year ending Apr. 30, 1935. This cut in half the appropriation generally received from the Town. Total receipts from all sources - including State appropriation - \$595.11

Total expenditures \$455.92 - Balance on hand \$142.19.

The Treasurer also reported that a legacy of \$200.00 under the will of Marshall W. Mowry received Feb. 19, 1934, had been placed on deposit in Savings Account as part of the permanent funds of the Library.
