Mrs. Jones presented a full report of the Book Committee. Among other items, she reported new cord trays purchased and 71 books. Since the book committee has taken care of upkeep of the Library Building such as replacing window pane removing wax from windows, repairing transformer, gas oil burner, it was Mrs. Jones' suggestion that a Custodial Committee be appointed to take care of these jobs as the need arises. Mrs. Jones said she had not purchased desk top as the price seemed prohibitive at this time. Her complete report was placed in the Secretary's files and was greatly commended by the members.

Mr. Ray K. Moore reported as the Cataloguing member of the book committee. He and Mrs. Moore have completed the processing of all Fiction (Adult) and Children's Section, plus new books purchased during the year. He recommended that the new circulation system be adopted on the next Library Day. The work of these members was noted with appreciation.

We were also grateful for the painting of the new pillars on the Library Porch and for the setting of the bushes at the rear of the building.

Mrs. Scott gave the Librarian's Report noting the fact that the circulation for the year was 2035 adult, 1895 juvenile making a total of 3930.

The Adult Librarian Mrs. Jones, gave her report which was placed in Secretary's Records. It was interesting to note the increase in number of card holders in the juvenile dept. to 120. This is 86 more than in June, 1951.
