A quarterly meeting of the Greenville Library Association was held on October 8, 1955, for the ratification of the contract for the erection of the Jucker Memorial Library Building at the northeast corner of Pleasant View Avenue and Putnam Pike.

A quorum was present, with the President in the chair.

The Treasurer reported an Operating Balance of \$522.45; a balance in the Building Fund (\$2856) of \$568.47; and a balance in the General Fund (\$880) of \$1010.35. He also reported that the records of accounts for the past year had been audited and approved.

The Librarian reported the number of card holders as 629, of whom 414 are juveniles and 215 are adults. Circulation from May 15 - Sept. 30 totalled 2910 volumes. Since last year's figure for the same period totalled 2,220, there has been an increase of 690 volumes in circulation.

The Secretary reported that notice of the date of the present meeting had been sent to more than fifty past and present members of the Association.

Although the chairman of the Book Committee was not present, two members of that committee reported that a meeting was held on Sept. 7th, and a considerable number of books were listed for ordering on the State appropriation.
