

was unanimously voted, should preferably be held on some Sunday in May with a musical prelude by Mrs Moore and a tea following the address.

Mrs Moore discussed the possibility of a summer concert for Members Only, and a series of subscription musicales in the Fall.

It was voted to make an initial payment of \$200. to Mr. Fernald for the piano, from money accumulated through Mrs Vaughn's bequest and gifts from Mrs Fudnick J. Pick and Miss Katharine Burlingame.

It was voted to increase the annual dues of membership in the Library Association to \$2. per year from May to May, with various other categories to be provided for on the printed invitation and subscription slips to be sent to prospective members. It was suggested that the special categories should comprise gifts of \$5, \$10, \$15, \$25, \$50. or more per year.

It was voted that a rental of \$7. should be charged for the full use of the facilities of the Library's lower floor, with a sliding scale for partial or less use of the building to be charged at the discretion of the House Committee, with a lower fee to be charged adult education groups, the community council in public schools, or such other groups as might wish to meet to discuss the civic improvement of the community. In other words, the opinion seemed to be that a group meeting for its personal enjoyment should pay more for the privilege than an educational group or one seeking to advance the good of the community - as a whole.

It was voted that Miss Stillwell be authorized to have the cave-in at the path leading from the parking lot repaired.

Mrs Moore spoke of a collection of moths and butterflies which Mrs Scott Barnes had offered to loan the Library for exhibition, and the meeting was adjourned - but another hour was spent over the coffee cups.
