

\$109.45 as noted above. In addition to the handicraft display, the paintings of thirty or more of the pupils of Mr. John F. Gallagher of Greenville were also exhibited and well toward six hundred persons attended the Festival.

The second art show opened on May 17 with a tea, after which the paintings were to remain on view on Library days during the rest of the month. This exhibition comprises fifty-seven entries submitted by Wilfred J. Dufhney of Johnston, John F. Gallagher of Greenville, C. Gordon Harris of Lincoln, *Janner A. King of Situate, and Mougant B. Stillwell - all of whom are or have been members of the Providence Art Club, The Providence Watercolor Club, The National Arts Club (New York), the Rockport Art Association and/or similar associations. The show comprised Landscapes and marines in watercolor and oils, several of large dimensions; pencil and pen-and-ink drawings; and portraits in sanguine (red chalk) and in oils. The value of this show totaled eight thousand five hundred dollars. Both this show and the craftwork displayed at the Festival were of high rank professionally.
