

head of the Highway Department. She also told of a conversation she had had with Mr. Thumber regarding the costs of laying a hard surface on the parking area; of repairing a neighbor's wall, a corner of which had been pushed over by the bulldozer in clearing the debris of the old shed; and of cutting down the old elm tree, from which branches have been falling on the grass and path leading to the rear entrance of the Library. As Chairman of the House Committee, she was authorized to get bids through Mr. Thumber and from other sources, and to report to the Chairman of the Maintenance Committee.

The relation of the new schedule of three Library days a week to the fines to be charged in the future for overdue books was discussed at some length.

Fines

It was voted that a fine of three cents should be charged for each Library day after the date on which the book became due.

As a means of honoring Children's Book Week, the Activities Committee suggested having a Junior Arts and Crafts Show. This idea was received with enthusiasm, and it was suggested from the floor that in October we have a tea and a talk on Alaska, by local persons who had recently been there.

The meeting then adjourned.
