Discussion centered upon the conference of Extension Librarians of New England and New York State, to meet at the Library on April 23rd. Mrs. Moore said that about 60 persons, accompanied by the bookmobile of the R. I. Bureau of Federal Aid for Rural Librarians, would come to the Library on that date. She suggested that after the morning panels, which would be held in the Down Study a buffet lunch at \$1.25 per person could be served by Miss Ethel Chase, a caterer. This plan was agreed upon, and the women members of the Committee and the wives of the men were tentatively assigned to various duties.

Mrs. Moore reported that the R. I. Library Association wished to hold its annual meeting at the Library on some Tuesday in May, the exact date being contingent upon the convenience of the village churches. That is, since the number of persons attending would be too many to be accommodated at the Library except for afternoon tea, it would be necessary to secure the use of parish rooms.

Mrs. Winsor was appointed to see if the meeting might be held in the vestry of the Baptist Church, and if luncheon might be served by the ladies of St. Thomas' Church in the parish rooms. May 10th was suggested as the most desirable date.

In view of the impending visits of such august bodies, it was felt that the building should be in prime condition. It was agreed that every effort should be made to have the new bookcase installed, a cover erected over the North door, the outside doors painted, and the trees and shrubs planted as voted.
