The Secretary's, Treasurer's, and Librarian's reports were read and approved.

The Activities Committee won approval for the plans of calling a March meeting of all of the Trustees of the rural libraries of Northwestern Rhode Island in advance of the state-wide Convention of Trustees to be held at the Providence Public Library in April; for inviting Professor Marion Wright of Rhode Island College to give an illustrated talk on Africa before the Greenville Library Association at a date to be determined; and for holding an art show and tea in May in recognition of the Library's 80th anniversary.

The remainder of the evening was spent in a detailed discussion of the budget for 1962-63, due to be submitted to the Town Council on February 21st.

It was voted that the library should be open six additional hours each week during the coming year. There was also considerable discussion regarding the painting of the outside woodwork and the weather-proofing of the building, together with the need for draining the area of the basement wall where water now enters.
