Progress report, House and Planning Committee.
In the interval since the last meeting of the Executive Committee, a filing-cabinet has been built into the upper coatroom, specially planned to accommodate posters and prints of various sizes. This was needed for the paraphernalia accumulated by Mrs Moore during the seven years in which she has voluntarily, and with skill and effectiveness, arranged frequent displays of books and pictures in the North entrance hall at the Library, and on special occasion in the school, the bank, and the local shops.
