June 27, 1964

The Annual Meeting of the Greenville Library Association was held June 27, 1964, in the Library. The meeting was called to order at 8:10 P. M. by Pres. K. K. Moore with the following in attendance: Mr. and Mrs. Moore, Mr. & Mrs. Winsor, Mrs. Deter, Mrs. Patt, Mrs. Normandin, Miss Stillwell, Mrs. Tapp, Mr. Fernald, and Mrs. Wright. This constituted a quorum. Before undertaking the business of the evening, a moment of silence was observed in honor of Miss Alice Cornstock, whose recent death saddened all who had the privilege of knowing her.

The Secretary's report was read, accepted, and ordered placed on file as was the Treasurer's report.

The Librarian's Report, which was read and accepted, showed an increase in circulation of over 2,000 books from the 15<sup>th</sup> of May '63 to the 15<sup>th</sup> of May of '64. We have over 1,000 children, who now have Library cards and about 790 adults. Mrs. Deter reported that Miss Dorothy Abbott has been of great help in cataloging.

Mrs. Moore reported for the Activity Committee touching on the Health League Exhibit held in the Library, the Christmas Program, the Spring Art Show by John J. McEwen, and spoke of a coming exhibit to be held in the Fall concerning old homes in Smithfield.

The Book Committee Report was covered by the Librarian's Report.

The Property and House Committee reported that the new charging desk had arrived and was being put to good use, as was the new little desk. The floors had been redone, and a new coffee pot had been purchased for the kitchen. Miss Stillwell showed us the plans for the proposed addition to the library and said that the firm of Johnson and Haynes had been chosen as architects. The plans were reviewed in great detail, and Mr. Fernald suggested putting a
