CommitteeMotion made and approved by the Executive Committee

That the President and Treasurer be hereby authorized to contract for and sign a continuance of the mortgage loan from the Citizens Trust Company, Greenville, for the sum of \$20,000.00 at 5% interest, payable semi-annually during a period of four years, the payment of interest to be contingent upon the sum actually borrowed and the loan, if not paid off, being renewable at the end of the four-year period.

That it be hereby authorized that the estimated sum of \$2,500.00, or such sum as may be needed for final payment to the architect and contractor of the new Young Peoples Wing, may be drawn from the loan of \$20,000.00 contracted for with the Citizens Trust Company and used for that purpose.

That the Building Committee be hereby authorized to draw from the Library's current funds a sum up to \$3,500.00 for the cost of remedial work upon the building and grounds.

That it be hereby authorized that the sum of \$9,000.00 may be drawn from the loan of \$20,000.00 contracted for with the Citizens Trust Company, and used for the initial costs of furnishing the new Young Peoples Wing.
