

Article 7.  
Alterations

This constitution may be altered or amended by a vote of two-thirds of members present at any regular meeting of the Association; provided, such alteration or amendment has been proposed at any regular meeting held at least three months previously.

BY-LAWS

Article 1.

The Executive Committee shall have the general charge and superintendence of the affairs, interests and property of the Association; shall make all requisite rules and regulations for its management; and shall make report of its action and of the state of the Association at the annual meeting.

Article 2.

The Executive Committee may appoint special committees on any subject connected with the interests of the Association; and shall annually appoint the Librarian and such Assistant Librarians as may be needed, and shall fix the amount of their compensation.

Article 3.

It shall be the duty of the President, and in his absence of one of the Vice-Presidents, to preside at all meetings of the Association and of the Executive Committee and to enforce and observe the rules established by parliamentary usage. The President shall be an ex-officio member of all committees.

Article 4.

The Secretary shall keep a correct record of the transactions of the Association and of the Executive Committee, conduct all correspondence and perform all duties pertaining to the office.

Article 5.

The Treasurer shall have charge of all finances, keep a true account of all monies received and paid out, render a report in writing whenever requested by the Executive Committee, and at each annual meeting present a detailed statement of the standing of the Association. The cost of the Treasurer's bond shall be met by the Association.

Article 6.

There shall be five Trustees to be elected at the annual meeting of the Association, said Trustees to serve for a three-year term. Upon adoption of these By-Laws, two shall be elected for a term of three years, two for a term of two years and one for a term of one year, thereafter the Trustees shall be elected for a three-year period as the terms expire.
